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FILE YOUR LIQUOR TAXES ON-LINE!

Did you know that Kansas offers a simple electronic file and pay solution for your Liquor taxes? You can use **KS WebTax for online filing and payment** for most business tax accounts, including your Liquor Enforcement and Liquor Drink tax types. First, go to **webtax.org** and create an email address and a password, then attach your business tax accounts. **Each tax account has a unique access code** that only needs to be entered once. This access code binds your account to your login ID. For future filings, you simply log into your account using your email address and password. A history of all returns filed or payments made electronically is retained in KS WebTax.

Electronic tax payments must be made on or before the due date. Using the KS WebTax system, you can have the Kansas Department of Revenue debit the tax payment electronically from your bank account (ACH Debit). Or, if you prefer, you may initiate the tax payment yourself through your bank (ACH Credit*). ** The ACH Credit option is NOT available for the "Liquor Drink" tax type.*

The **online KS WebTax** application is **simple, safe, FREE** and conveniently available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week! There are many **other advantages and efficiencies to filing and paying electronically** – your return preparation is more accurate with built in edits, you get an acknowledgment that your return is received, and there is no check to write or form to mail. Additionally, reducing paper consumption is both cost effective and environmentally friendly. These efficiencies are more important than ever as businesses and government try to find ways to provide quality service at a reduced cost.
