

DEFINITIONS OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR AND CEREAL MALT BEVERAGE

DESCRIPTION	DEFINITION
Beer	A beverage, containing more than 3.2% alcohol by weight, obtained by alcoholic fermentation of an infusion or concoction of barley, or other grain, malt and hops in water and includes beer, ale, stout, lager beer, porter and similar beverages having such alcoholic content.
Cereal Malt Beverage (CMB)	Any fermented but undistilled liquor brewed or made from malt or from a mixture of malt or malt substitute or any flavored malt beverage, as defined in K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 41-2729, and amendments thereto, but does not include any such liquor which is more than 3.2% alcohol by weight.
Domestic Beer	Beer which contains not more than 10% alcohol by weight and which is manufactured in this state.
Domestic Fortified Wine	Wine which contains more than 14%, but not more than 20% alcohol by volume and which is manufactured in this state.
Domestic Light Wine	Wine which contains not more than 14% alcohol by volume and which is manufactured without rectification or fortification in this state.
Flavored Malt Beverage (FMB) - Strong	A beverage, containing more than 4% alcohol by volume, obtained by alcoholic fermentation of an infusion or concoction of barley, or other grain, malt and hops in water and includes beer, ale, stout, lager beer, porter and similar beverages having such alcoholic content.
Flavored Malt Beverage (FMB) - Weak	A beverage, containing no more than 4% alcohol by volume, obtained by alcoholic fermentation of an infusion or concoction of barley, or other grain, malt and hops in water and includes beer, ale, stout, lager beer, porter and similar beverages having such alcoholic content.
Fortified Wine	Any alcoholic beverage containing more than 14% alcohol by volume obtained by the normal alcoholic fermentation of the juice of sound, ripe grapes, fruits, berries or other agricultural products, including such beverages containing added alcohol or spirits or containing sugar added for the purpose of correcting natural deficiencies.
Light Wine	Any alcoholic beverage containing no more than 14% alcohol by volume obtained by the normal alcoholic fermentation of the juice of sound, ripe grapes, fruits, berries or other agricultural products, including such beverages containing added alcohol or spirits or containing sugar added for the purpose of correcting natural deficiencies.
Spirits	Any beverage which contains alcohol obtained by distillation, mixed with water or other substance in solution, and includes brandy, rum, whiskey, gin or other spirituous liquors, and such liquors when rectified, blended or otherwise mixed with alcohol or other substances.
